

Wacky TEST TUBES

INSTRUCTIONS

PREPARATION OF LIQUID CONCENTRATE

Note:- Do not mix old liquid with new liquid. The miniature items enclosed with this pack are to be used only with the new liquid you will make up with this kit.

STEP 1

Find the large liquid holders. Each jar is marked with its own special colour e.g. Rancid Red, Yucky Yellow etc.

STEP 2

Fill each jar with (very warm) tap water to the 2 litre fill line marked on the jar. Empty one bag of solute powder into each jar. Now mix the warm water and solute powder together until completely dissolved. This may take a few minutes.

STEP 3

Finally add the colour concentrate for each colour jar, mix it in until completely diluted.

OTHER POINTS

Warning sign slips enclosed contain general guidance as you would get with many toy/craft products sold to consumers. Warning signs can either be put into each test tube prior to handing it to the customer or after they have completed the test tube activity.

Use an old towel on the table to soak up any drips that may occur whilst the children are pipetting the liquid into their test tubes.

Make up at least one test sample prior to commencing with the activity so you familiarise yourself with how the activity works. To make a sample see below 'How the Activity Works'.

HOW THE ACTIVITY WORKS

1. Children choose which characters they want and pop them into the test tube.

How many characters do the children put into the test tube? We suggest the following The Hold (small) test tube - 3 characters The Bends (medium) test tube - 4 characters The Porthole (large) test tube - 5 characters

2. The child dispenses the coloured liquid into the test tube.
3. Add a tiny amount of glitter, just a pinch will do or half a tiny spoon (if special tiny spoon has been provided).
4. Now an adult can place cap on to test tube for the child. Hold the test tube firmly and snap on the cap.
5. Hand out warning sign if this wasn't done at the beginning.

Now the child can shake it and take it!

Note: - The snap on caps are a tight fit so a little practice beforehand would help smooth running of the activity.
